The Most Rev. Frank T. Griswold
Presiding Bishop, The Episcopal Church, USA

THE MOST REV. FRANK T. GRISWOLD
XXV PRESIDING BISHOP
THE EPISCOPAL CHURCH, USA

Frank Griswold was elected to a nine-year term as Presiding Bishop at the 1997 General Convention and invested in January 1998. He serves as Primate and chief pastor of the Episcopal Church, president of the House of Bishops, president and chief executive officer of the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society, and president or chair of numerous Episcopal Church boards and agencies.

Before becoming Presiding Bishop, Bishop Griswold was Bishop of Chicago (1987-1997) and Bishop Coadjutor (1985-1987). He was ordained in 1963 and served three parishes in the Diocese of Pennsylvania before being elected bishop.

Currently, Bishop Griswold co-chairs the Anglican-Roman Catholic International Commission. He has served on diocesan, national and international committees for liturgy, worship and ecumenism. He was on the standing committee for the Lambeth Conference and was elected to the Primates Standing Committee in May, 2003.

Frank Griswold has presented at and led conferences and retreats nationally and internationally throughout his ministry, spanning a variety of topics including ecumenism, evangelism, spirituality and theology.

His articles, essays and sermons have been published in periodicals and theological journals including *Anglican Theological Review*, *Episcopal Life* (monthly column), *Cross Currents*, *Anglican Advance* and many others. His daily meditations from the General Convention of 2000 produced a Cowley Publications Cloister Book entitled *Going Home*.

The Presiding Bishop was educated at St. Paul's School in Concord, N.H. and earned an A.B. in English literature at Harvard College (1959). He attended the General Theological Seminary and earned his B.A. and M.A. in theology at Oriel College, Oxford University (1962, 1966). He has received honorary degrees from the General Theological Seminary, Seabury-Western Theological Seminary, Nashotah House, Sewanee and Berkeley Divinity School.

Bishop Griswold and his wife, Phoebe Wetzel Griswold, have two adult daughters.

THE VERY REV. GEORGE L.W. WERNER
31ST PRESIDENT, THE HOUSE OF DEPUTIES

An apt description of George Werner's three year Presidency of the House of Deputies is that he brings all voices to the table, tirelessly honoring a commitment to include all parts and parties of this branch of the Body of Christ. He continues to seek new and different faces for Committees, Commissions, Agencies and Boards (CCABs) of the Church. In a time of too little trust, he is an encouraging and collaborative proponent for justice, mission and evangelism.

Born in Rockaway Beach, Queens, New York, Werner earned a BA from Lafayette College in Easton, PA, and an MDiv from the Berkeley Divinity School in New Haven, and has received Doctors of Divinity (honoris causa) from Berkeley at Yale and Nashotah House.

In the Diocese of Connecticut Werner was ordained deacon in 1962 and priest in 1963, serving first as a curate in Milford and then rector in inner-city Bridgeport. In 1968, he was called to Manchester (NH) to be rector of a parish while also working on the bishop's staff. He moved to downtown Pittsburgh in 1979 to become Dean of Historic Trinity Cathedral, where he served until 2000.

Ever juggling a full schedule, he was active in his dioceses and the wider Church. He has served in the House of Deputies since 1970 while accepting the responsibilities of membership on Church Pension Fund; Committee on the State of the Church; the Standing Committee on Health (Chair); Councils of Advice to two Presidents of the House of Deputies, and Venture in Mission (National Vice-President.) He was elected Vice-President of the Senior House in 1994 and 1997 and President in 2000. As President, he serves as Vice Chair of Executive Council and *ex officio* on many CCA Bs.

Dean Werner is a secular leader, having co-founded 501(C)(3) organizations to serve the disenfranchised, and one economic development organization. In the 60's, he hosted one of the first Head Start programs and was an officer of Legal Aid. In New Hampshire he co-founded a halfway house for young men leaving the State Industrial School. Werner continues to work extensively in the world of healthcare in the University of Pittsburgh Health Care System, as Chair of Behavioral Medicine and on several committees.

A witness for Jesus Christ in both secular and sacred communities, he reminded the provincial synods he visited this year, "In a time of vulnerability, of dread and enmity, we are called more than ever to be the example of Christ and serve as his wounded, loving hands, reaching out to all."

He is the husband of the former Audrey Volker, father of four children, and the indomitable and doting grandfather of nine.

WELCOME TO MINNEAPOLIS

Engage God's Mission is an invitation to each of us as we gather in Minneapolis to respond in new ways to God's presence among us. The primary work of our time together is to take council, to seek wisdom and to renew our Church through a legislative process. Our days begin in prayer, with the Holy Eucharist and shared reflection on Scripture. It is our hope that the 74th General Convention will be a time when we **receive, repent, reconcile and restore** as a community of faith and move forward to **Engage God's Mission**.

This booklet is intended to give you an easy reference to our schedule for the 74th General Convention and the Triennial Meeting of the Episcopal Church Women. It is important to note that there will be legislative sessions on Saturday morning and Sunday afternoon. The "Sabbath time" for participants in the Convention begins Saturday afternoon and concludes on Sunday afternoon.

The Communication Office of the Episcopal Church will be sponsoring evening summaries available for viewing on the hotel television stations. These news stories will feature general information about the Convention along with updates on issues that will be coming before us.

Once again we will have the opportunity to dialogue with persons in our Church with experience in particular issues and ministries. The Evening of Conversations on July 30 will feature these discussions:

- Christian Hope: *How has the experience of September 11 and its aftermath changed the spirituality of the churches, particularly the idea of Christian hope?*
- Christians, Jews and Muslims: *How can these three widely diverse communities work creatively together for reconciliation in the world as it is today?*
- War and Peace: *How can we balance ethical demands with the need to feel secure? How can we think about war, especially the Christian idea of a "just war," when faced with crises like those in Afghanistan, Iraq, and throughout the Middle East?*
- Who Owns 20/20: *At a time of cultural shifts, threats of war, and economic uncertainty, the 20/20 movement challenges us to grow and flourish, anoint new leaders, and raise up nontraditional ministries. How can the whole church come to own this movement?*
- Receive, Repent, Reconcile, Restore: *What new models and ways of being do Christians need in order to become communities of forgiveness and healing in light of these ethical imperatives we encounter daily?*
- Additionally, Jubilee Ministries will share about its important work and service to God, which is integral to the Church's mission.

The General Convention Eucharist and United Thank Offering In-Gathering will take place on Sunday, August 3 in the Convention Center worship space. This service is a remarkable time of celebration and renewal.

Our exhibitors bring an amazing variety of ministries, arts, services and other useful information that will enrich your participation in the General Convention. Please make some time to visit them. On your way into the Exhibit Area you will find The Episcopal Church Center booth. Here you will be able to meet many of the staff who serve you during the triennium and learn more about the program and mission of our Church.
