The Christ Church Cathedral convened 2 live webinars in June featuring testimony from 2 Black leader, one from the Cathedral and one from Worcester. (The Cathedral has a vibrant hispanic ministry and Spanish services.) This was a response (and there may have been others in the diocese) to George Floyd's murder. But was not part of any diocesan effort around race, ethnic make-up or histories, or hiring practices.

Several parishes hosted/joined with other churches, community organizations in June 2019 for Lights for Liberty.

The Social Justice Commission hosted a day conference "Bending Toward Justice" in January 2020. Wider interest was generated but the momentum came to a standstill as congregations had to pivot to adjusting to on line worship, etc.

Several parishes partnered with National Parks Service in ringing their church bells on August 25, 2019 to commemorate the 400th anniversary of enslaved persons in colonial territories on this continent. Prayers and speeches, clergy and lay, and the Bishop was present at the joint service of Grace, Great Barrington and St. Paul's in Stockbridge. One of the members of our commission invited the administration of Tanglewood Music Festival to ring "bells" before the season finale of Beethoven's 9th Symphony. Spreading the word of 2019 reached several thousand people that day.

Many priests in the diocese have preached on race, especially after the murder of George Floyd. This survey has prompted us to construct an easily accessible archive and invite clergy to submit these sermons. Bishop Fisher has preached on race and his sermons and blog posts are archived.

Sacred Ground circles began at St. John's Williamstown last summer and that parish now has 3 more groups beginning in July 2020. A group in South Berkshire County begins in August. There may be other groups but we realize it would be good to connect all the groups throughout the diocese.

This July we had two 2-session zoom book discussions on Thurman's Jesus and the Disinherited, our choice for diocesan wide BBC book read 2020.

There was at least one parish that watched the new film of Just Mercy (which was our diocesan book selection in 2017).

Local engagement with immigration reform--several parishes in Berkshire County are involved with Berkshire Interfaith Organizing who provided training for several Episcopalians who accompany immigrants to check-ins with ICE and court appearances.

The Rev. Dr. Margaret Bullit-Jonas, Climate Care Missioner, Diocese of WMA and UCC, preaches to diocesan congregations regularly and provides national witness to these efforts, including the intersection of race and climate.

The Diocese has several outside the building "cathedral" ministries in public spaces. Cathedral of the Beloved in Pittsfield,MA, is hosting a "Building the Beloved Community Middle School Adventure in Community & Justice" serving meals 4 Sundays and 3 weekly zoom meetings covering history of racism in this country, current events, and justice and faith, July and August 2020.

There is one women's prison in the diocese and we have a priest/chaplain there. (Not a diocesan effort.)
