





# Somos Episcopales / We are Episcopalians

There are close to 300 Latino congregations in the United States. There is likely a Latino congregation or Spanish language service in an Episcopal church near you.

Did you know that Latino worship is also conducted in English? The question for The Episcopal Church is how do we learn to evangelize and welcome both the immigrant and native-born Latinos into our branch of the Jesus Movement? The Latino Competency Course is one answer to that question.

In August, 16 Episcopalians—lay, clergy, and seminarians—gathered at Sewanee University in Tennessee, seeking to use intellectual and cultural tools to discern and explore the type of Latino/ Hispanic ministry that best fits their congregational/diocesan setting. In one of the workshops, titled "Social

Demographics of the Latinos in the U.S.," the Rev.Anthony Guillén used data and statistics to challenge Anglo biases and misperceptions surrounding the cultural and geographic background of our Hispanic/Latino neighbors, and what it means for our outreach and evangelism.


