The 68th session of the United Nations Commission on the Status of Women (CSW68) will be held from Monday, 3/11 to Friday, 3/22/2024. Since 1946, UNCSW has convened annually to promote women's rights in political, economic, civil, social, and educational fields, and to make recommendations on urgent problems facing women and girls. It reached a turning point in 1995 at the Fourth World Conference on Women with the adoption of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action, a global policy framework for gender equality and the empowerment of women that set out 12 Critical Areas of Concern. UNCSW 68's priority theme will be "Accelerating the achievement of gender equality and the empowerment of all women and girls by addressing poverty and strengthening institutions and financing with a gender perspective".

Anglicans and Episcopalians at UNCSW68

Anglicans and Episcopalians have participated in UNCSW since at least 2000. In 2024, the historically strong Anglican and Episcopal presence continues with participants representing multiple regions and countries:

- The Anglican Communion will be represented by Mathilde Nkwirikiye, Provincial President of the Mothers' Union in Burundi, Anglican Province of Burundi; Alice Garrick, Director of the Women's Desk Anglican Church of Pakistan, International Anglican Women's Network Steering Group; The Reverend Lizzi Green, Vice Chair of the International Anglican Women's Network, Church of England; The Reverend Helen Van Koevering, the Episcopal Church and Mozambique link, International Anglican Women's Network Steering Group; The Reverend Laura Marie Piotrowicz, Ecumenical Women worship coordinator, Anglican Church of Canada; Amal Sarah, Advocacy Coordinator Anglican Communion Youth Network (online); and Lay Canon Lulama Ntuta, Anglican Youth of Southern Africa (online)
- The Episcopal Church welcomes 10 delegates, nominated by The Reverend Canon Dr. Chuck Robertson, Canon for Ministry Beyond the Episcopal Church, on behalf of Presiding Bishop Michael Bruce Curry. They hail from provinces across The Episcopal Church and the Dioceses of California, Chicago, Colombia, Long Island, Los Angeles, New York, Ohio, Tennessee, Venezuela, and Western New York. They are guided and accompanied by members of the Presiding Bishop's staff and other leadership volunteers. Delegates will observe the official UNCSW meetings, represent the Presiding Bishop and the Church's written statement submitted to UNCSW, network and meet with UN officials and representatives of member states, advocate alongside ecumenical and interfaith partners, attend side and parallel events and reflect during UNCSW on how to take their experiences back home to their communities and train up new leaders. Presiding Bishop & Primate Michael Bruce Curry submitted a written statement to UNCSW's 68th session on behalf of The Episcopal Church, which is based on General Convention resolutions, and can be found here: <u>E/CN.6/2024/NGO/53</u>. It highlights three priorities to accelerate gender equality and the empowerment of women and girls in all their diversity around the priority theme:

- Eradicate poverty
- Strengthen institutions
- Strengthen financing

The Episcopal Church also signed on to a joint written statement with Ecumenical Women: E/CN.6/2024/NGO/143.

The Presiding Bishop's delegation will participate actively in advocacy at the UN based on the Presiding Bishop's statement, including training, advocacy and communication with member states, and continuing advocacy back home with their local communities. The statement serves as a foundation by which delegates may share their own stories, reflections, and concerns.
